Can you assist parties in dispute to reach agreement?

The Domain Name Commission is responsible for managing the .nz domain name space (all domain names ending .nz) and administers a Dispute Resolution Service (DRS). The DRS is a quick and cost-effective way of resolving domain name disputes and offers an accessible alternative to the courts. We are currently inviting applications for three Mediator positions - please note that existing Mediators whose terms are up will be invited to reapply.

Under the .nz DRS, mediation is the first tier of dispute resolution, and involves the mediator facilitating telephone (and email) mediation between parties to a domain name dispute within a set timeframe.

Each mediator will be assigned by rotation to a dispute, and can expect to handle up to five disputes a year, with a fixed remuneration of \$1,400 (excl GST) per dispute.

In order to be considered for one of these positions, you will have a general knowledge of domain name issues as well as proven track record in mediation. Suitable candidates may be involved in the internet industry, mediation or arbitration, or legal profession, and will be a member of an appropriate professional organisation.

Applications are invited by sending your CV and a covering letter. Successful candidates will be retained on a fixed term contract.
